What is ESCO?

- Formed originally as the UK Electronics Alliance following the EIGT Report published by the DTI in 2005 to address 'the fragmented, diverse nature of the (electronics) industry, and its difficulty representing itself to Government and vice versa, (which has) led to delays in addressing some of the key issues which impact on its performance'
- Following publication of the ESCO Report in June 2014, became ESCO comprising a Council of senior industrialists and Executive comprising the UK's leading electronics industry trade associations
- ESCO acts:
 - as a two-way communication channel between industry and Government departments and agencies
 - collaboratively with its members and other representative bodies
 - to further the interests of the UK electrotechnical systems community on a wide range of issues
























Counterfeit / fraudulent components are often meeting a supply shortage

Components are often 'recycled' from illegally exported WEEE, 'cleaned up', re-marked with new date or batch codes, sometimes with higher spec codes....



Counterfeit / fraudulent components can often be detected with fairly simple inspection











And poor sources of supply can often be identified with basic research




What is ESCO doing on counterfeiting?

- Established effective working relationships with key contacts in relevant Government departments: BIS, HMRC, IPO, MoD
- Works with ACI, BEAMA, GAMBICA and LIA within the Electrotechnical Market Surveillance group
- Member of the IP Crime Group
- Organises educational / information sharing events
- Contributes to / presented at other organisations' events
- Raises relevant regulatory issues via the ERG and the IP Crime Group
- Manages the Anti Counterfeiting Forum website









The website in numbers


as at 18 June 2015
